Jonah

STORY POINT: GOD LOVES ALL PEOPLE AND SHOWED MERCY TO THE NINEVITES.

God told Jonah, "Go to the great city of Nineveh. Tell them to stop doing evil things." Jonah did not want to go. He got on a boat heading the other way! God sent a terrible storm, and the sailors were afraid. The sailors asked Jonah, "Who are you? What are you doing here?"

Jonah replied, "I worship the one true God who made everything."

The sailors did not know what to do, so Jonah told them to throw him into the sea. When they did, the storm stopped. God sent a big fish to swallow Jonah. Jonah prayed and thanked God for sending the fish to save him. Then the fish vomited Jonah onto dry land.

God told Jonah, "Go to Nineveh and preach My message." So Jonah went. He shouted God's message: "In 40 days, Nineveh will be destroyed!"

The people turned from their evil ways. Even the king repented. God decided not to destroy Nineveh.

"I knew it!" Jonah said. "You are a gracious God. I knew You would decide to not destroy Nineveh. I am so mad!"


"Is it right for you to be angry?" God asked. "Yes!" Jonah said.

Hosea, Prophet to Israel

Hosea

STORY POINT: GOD IS FAITHFUL TO HIS PEOPLE EVEN WHEN THEY DO NOT LOVE HIM.

God wanted to send a message to His people. So God gave instructions to the prophet Hosea. "Marry a woman who will not be faithful to you," God said. "Be a father to her children." God was going to use Hosea's life to show His people in Israel what God's love for them was like. Hosea's wife would love other men instead of Hosea, just like the people of Israel loved and worshiped other gods instead of the one true God.

Hosea obeyed God. He married a woman named Gomer. Gomer was not faithful to Hosea. She often ran away. In the same way, God's people turned away from Him. They worshiped false gods. God told Hosea to go after his wife. So Hosea found Gomer and paid to get her back.


Gomer had not loved her husband like a wife should, but Hosea loved her anyway. God gave Hosea a love that would never give up. God wanted the people of Israel to understand that they were like Gomer. The Israelites did not love God like they should, but God loved Israel anyway.

Just like Hosea paid a high price to get back his wife who did not love him, God had a plan to get His people back no matter the cost.

Christ Connection: God used Hosea's unfaithful wife to show the people of Israel that they were unfaithful to Him. God gave Hosea a deep love; Hosea was willing to buy back Gomer even after all she had done. God's love is deep, and it never gives up. He goes after His people and paid a great price to get us back.

STORY POINT: ISRAEL IGNORED GOD'S PROPHETS AND WAS CAPTURED.

God had done so many good things for the Israelites. Even though God loved them like a father, the Israelites forgot about God. They worshiped things that were not God, and they did exactly what God told them not to do.

So God sent prophets to warn the people to stop doing evil things. The prophets said bad things would happen if they did not obey God. Did Israel obey? No. In fact, they sinned even more!

God finally had enough. He loved His people too much to let them continue in their sin and rebellion. So God punished the people of Israel by letting their enemies take over.


One day, the king of Assyria and his army attacked Israel. King Hoshea was thrown into prison. The Assyrian army surrounded the capital of Israel.

Finally, the king of Assyria captured Samaria and forced the people to leave their homes. He made them walk hundreds of miles to Assyria. The Northern Kingdom of Israel was destroyed.

Christ Connection: When the Israelites disobeyed God again and again, God punished them by removing them from His presence. We disobey God, but Jesus took the punishment for our sin upon Himself. Jesus brings us into God's presence and keeps us there.
