of encouragement to the people of Ephesus while he was in prison.



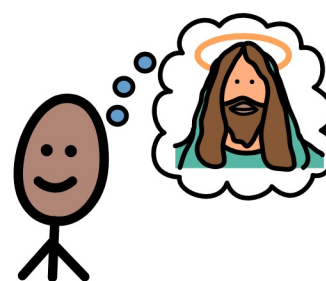

This included how they should talk to each other.

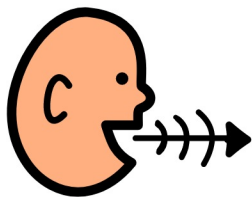
